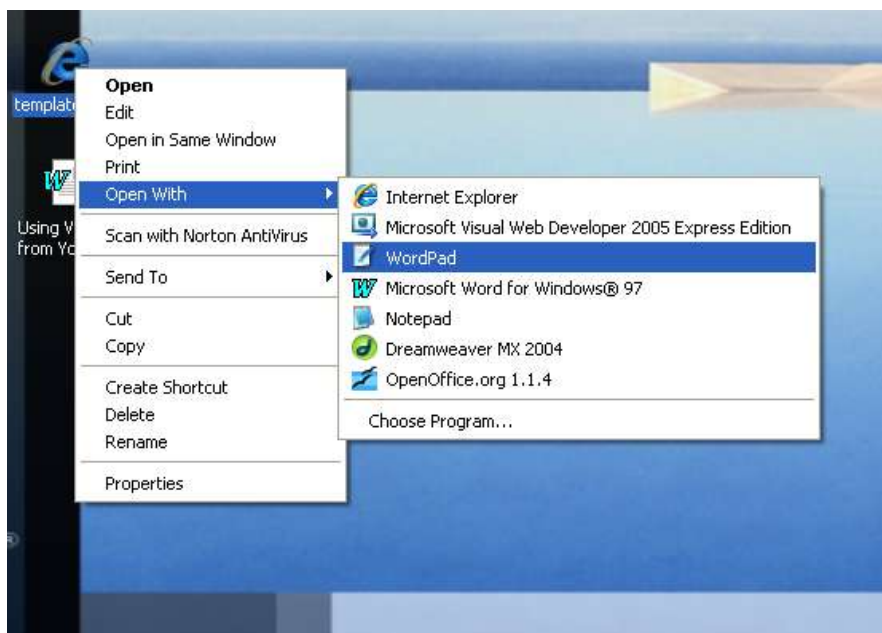

Creating a video worksheet

- ❑ First download the sample template from my blog onto your desktop. You can do this by right clicking on the link called '**template.htm**' and then clicking on '**Save target as**'.
- ❑ Then go to www.youtube.com and find a suitable video clip that you would like to use with your students. You can either check through the categories at: <http://www.youtube.com/categories>
Or use the search to look for something specific.
 - ❑ I did a search on '**Monty Python**' and this produced quite a few usable videos like this one '**Silly Job interview**':

- ❑ To embed this into my template I simply right click on the template on my desktop and open it with '**WordPad**'.




- ❑ Then I go to the webpage that has the video clip on and copy the code that is in the '**Embed**' field (This is usually just to the right of the video).

- ❑ Then I paste the code into the template at the appropriate place below the title (see below)

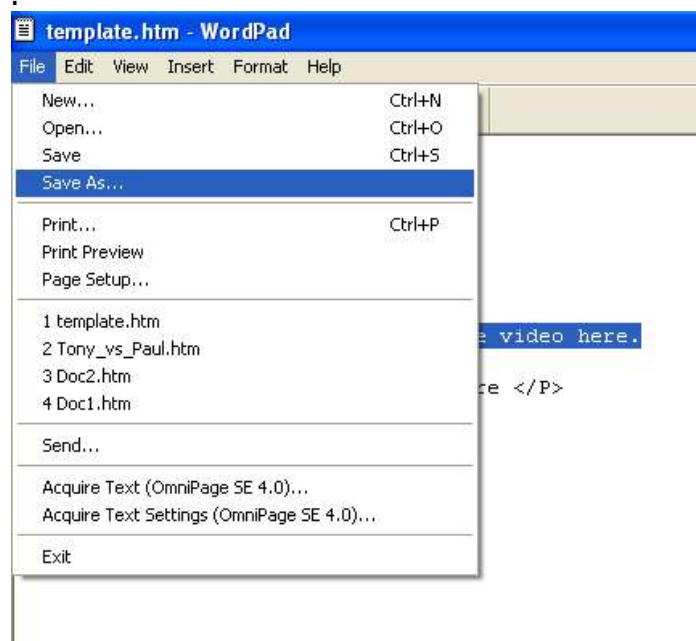

- Then all I need to do is add a title above the video and add my instructions or text below it.
- I then save it with a new name by going to file and '**Save as**'. I called it '**interview**'.



- Then I go back to the desktop and open my new file with Internet explorer. (When you open the file you may get a security warning, but you just need to click on '**Allow Blocked Content**' and the video should open.
